Writing

In our writing this term, we will be



focusing on a range of genres of writing and we will be using our 'Towers, Tunnels and Turrets' topic as a stimulus for some of this. We will be using the story 'Bog Baby' as a focus for writing and will complete a variety of different genres linked to this.

We are going to focus on:

- Stories
- Diaries
- Letters
- instructions

We will also focus on standalone literacy skills such as spelling patterns, word classes and grammar activities.

<u>Reading</u>

We have a big focus on reading this year in Year 2. In our reading time we will have time for independent reading as well as time for 1-1 reading with the teacher. It is important that children develop a love of reading so please encourage any reading possible at home. Encouraging children to re-read favourite stories (regardless of the stories' target age) is a great way to develop this love. Home reader should be signed and returned to school on a Friday and will be sent out on a Monday with several books for the week. Please read books several times for children to become fluent.

<u>Maths</u>

In Maths this term, we will be covering the following areas in great depth. We will learn the concepts and processes used for each before moving into problem solving in these areas.

We will focus on:

- Place value
- Addition and Subtraction
- Money

You can help your child at home by practising the 2,5 and 10 times tables and practise telling the time.

will be focusing on racket


